

Classroom discussion, also known as substantive conversation or instructional conversation, is a teaching method that focuses on the active exchange of ideas. Classroom discussion gives students a role in constructing knowledge, allowing them to process, rather than simply receive, information. Although classroom discussions are facilitated by the teacher, they are open-ended, encouraging the expression of multiple points of view and opportunities for self-reflection. They can be used at any grade level and in any content area.

The use of discussion as an educational tool has its origins in the method of dialogue and questioning employed by the Ancient Greek philosopher Socrates. In modern education, classroom...





How is ProQuest One Education Being Used?

Research

A Graduate Student with a focus on policy:
Needs to trace the history of a policy and discuss its impact and effectiveness

- They pick a policy by browsing the Topic Pages.
- They view reports to understand its implementation.
- See impact and reception in news and magazine articles
- And its effectiveness discussed in journals and dissertations.

Teaching

A Professor preparing for a class on early childhood literacy:
They want to find videos showing different ways of reading to a nursery school classroom.

- They start with the Early Literacy Development Topic Page and select a video
- They go to advanced search and choose 'emergent literacy' from the ERIC thesaurus and choose 'video' as the source type.

Learning

An Undergraduate Student taking an introductory research class:
Has to suggest an unstudied research topic, explore past methods used, and consider already studied populations.

- They get ideas from the "trending topics" on the homepage, then view the relevant Topic Page.
- They use the research methodology and population researched facets to identify new groups or methods to use.
