Award of Recognition to George S. Tavlas

To mark the 30th anniversary of the International Conference on Macroeconomic Analysis and International Finance, the Organizing Committee honored Dr. George S. Tavlas with an award of recognition for his continuous and valuable contribution to the conference.

Dr. George S. Tavlas is Alternate to the Governor of the Bank of Greece on the Governing Council of the European Central Bank and Distinguished Visiting Fellow at the Hoover Institution, Stanford University. He is the Editor-in-Chief of *Open Economies Review*, an Associate Editor of *Macroeconomic Dynamics* and the *Journal of Forecasting*, and a member of the editorial board of several highly respected journals.

Dr. Tavlas has also held a number of senior policy and research positions, at the Bank of Greece and the Eurosystem. He participated in the management and resolution of the sovereign crisis in Greece and was involved in the process of Greece's entry into the Eurozone as a key advisor to the governors of the Bank of Greece.

Before joining the Bank of Greece, Dr. Tavlas held several positions at the International Monetary Fund, the U.S. Department of State, the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development and the World Bank. He has also held a number of visiting and professional positions at universities and international economic policy institutions.

His research interests cover the broad areas of economic history, international economics, macroeconomics and monetary economics. His research has been published in leading journals in economics and finance and has also written and edited books, monographs, book reviews, and policy-oriented publications. His latest book, *The Monetarists: The Making of the Chicago Monetary Tradition, 1927-1960*, was published by the University of Chicago Press.
